### **School Overview**

The idea of ARCH started in 2005 for students involved in Academic Decathlon and was modeled after the exemplary work of Cesar Chavez High School Advanced Placement teacher and Academic Decathlon Coach, Mr. William Kibler. During the 2021-2022 school year, PXU adopted ARCH as a micro-school under the direction of Dr. Angela Foreman, and is now under the leadership of Mrs. Cami Wells, M.A., M.Ed.

The goal of ARCH is to help our students secure competitive scholarship packages that make attending a college out of state as affordable, if not more affordable, than attending college in Arizona. Each year, ARCH continues to systematize and expand practices to support students through high standards, so that they can access competitive universities around the country.

ARCH is designed for students who are seeking admission to competitive colleges or universities. The primary attribute is motivation. More than grades, we are seeking students who are motivated to achieve more, to improve themselves, and to challenge their own boundaries. We are seeking students who are willing to think outside of the box, consistently seek to do better, and become global citizens who create instead of just participate.

We believe that students in ARCH need to have the mindset of continuous growth and be the best version of themselves, both academically and non-academically. ARCH students are expected to learn at a deeper level, engage in community, and be driven as leaders in all facets of their lives. #### **Applicant Information for Admissions**

## **Notification of Application Status**

Students will be notified of their application status by electronic mail. Students will be notified of acceptance, placement on the wait list, or non-acceptance.

Please note: ARCH will continue to accept applications and schedule interviews until enrollment capacity has been reached. If there are more qualified applicants than spaces available, a lottery will be used to select students for enrollment. After a lottery, a wait list will be maintained for qualified applicants if openings in enrollment occur. A lottery will again be used to fill any new openings.

## **ARCH Student Expectations**

The ARCH Micro-School prepares students to be attractive candidates for highly competitive colleges, universities, and scholarships. To meet these goals, students can expect to persevere through several expectations that will stretch and grow them. Our teachers, known as ARCH Mentors, will help students every step of the way. Below are expectations for ARCH students:

Demonstrate exemplary academic and behavioral conduct. Students in ARCH adhere to an academic Honor Code and are expected to be campus leaders. When students demonstrate integrity, positivity, and creativity, teachers typically have no difficulty recommending them for colleges, universities, and scholarships. Failure to demonstrate exemplary academic conduct (Ds or Fs and/or behavior (more than two disciplinary referrals, parents will be called and a probationary contract will be issued. If the contract is not withheld throughout the entirety of the issuing school year, the student may be removed from ARCH with recommendations that will work best for the student for the remainder of their time at Chavez High School.

Work closely with an assigned ARCH Mentor. Our ARCH Mentors get to know students throughout their time in high school, serve as liaisons to parents and teachers, and advocate for students' needs as they navigate high school and prepare for college.

Starting Freshman year, students should take a **minimum** of three (3) honors or AP courses per semester. These may include core academic courses or electives. Academic rigor demonstrates to colleges, universities, and scholarship committees that students have challenged themselves throughout high school.

Commit to strong academics: high grades and consistent growth. Colleges, universities, and scholarships typically weigh students' grades heavily. Students enrolled in ARCH can expect ARCH Mentors to provide support when grades drop below As and Bs.

Students enrolled in ARCH will typically not be able to participate in AVID or in half-day programs through Metro Tech High School, as these opportunities have different emphases than ARCH and limit ARCH students' options for taking courses to prepare for highly competitive colleges, universities, and scholarships.

Complete at least twenty (30) hours of documented community service per calendar year. Students are responsible for maintaining logs of community service and for getting signatures. Colleges, universities, and scholarship committees seek students who serve their communities and develop skills to work with adults.

Starting sophomore year, attend at least one college fair per school year. One of the great benefits of joining ARCH is the opportunity to learn about colleges and universities that many students have not explored; we want students to make informed decisions about their college or university selections. One of the best ways to learn about colleges and universities is through college fairs.

Attend ARCH seminars. These take place during Advisory roughly twice a month and are a significant way that ARCH prepares students for success in the college admissions process and beyond. Students should avoid conflicts with seminars and should communicate in advance with the ARCH Micro School Leader in situations when conflicts arise.

## **Overview of ARCH Application Process**

The ARCH application incorporates components that highly selective colleges and universities use in their applications: three required components and one recommended component.

Most applicants will need to preview the application, gather information, draft thoughtful responses, and return later to complete the application.

#### **Required Components:**

- Basic Information Provide basic information about the applicant. All enrolled ARCH students will be concurrently enrolled at Cesar Chavez High School (CCHS). Students who are not already enrolled at Cesar Chavez High School when applying to ARCH will need to provide a bit more information than students who are currently enrolled at CCHS because CCHS's records will not yet have enrollment information.
- Short Answer Questions and Essay Complete short answer and essay questions.
   Applicants should give thoughtful responses to each question. These questions help to form the ARCH Selection Committee's first impressions of the applicant.
   Applicants will need to reference the ARCH Student Expectations in some responses.
- 3. Teacher Recommendation Indicate which teacher or staff/mentor the applicant will ask for a recommendation. Of the two recommendations, only one teacher recommendation is required. The other recommendation can be from a mentor, a coach, clergy, or other non-related adult that can offer valuable input concerning the applicant, so that the ARCH Selection Committee gain a fuller understanding of the applicant's interests, abilities, and goals. It is the applicant's responsibility to follow up with the people that they ask to recommend them.

#### **Recommended Component:**

Interview – An interview will help the ARCH Selection Committee understand the
applicant better, providing the committee insight that may not initially emerge
from written components of the application. Interviews will include at least one
adult from the ARCH Selection Committee. Historically, enrolled ARCH students
have helped to conduct interviews of ARCH applicants.

#### **Selection of ARCH Students:**

The ARCH Selection Committee will review all completed applications. New ARCH students will be selected based upon three things:

- Meeting minimum scores on the written application.
- Availability of open seats in ARCH.
- Highest scores among applicants, if open seats in ARCH cannot accommodate all applicants who meet minimum scores.
